Heinz Foods had come to the end of a tenancy agreement and were contracted to carry out dilapidations works prior to formal handover of the building to the owners. Works Completed

Building Projects Group's scope included:

- Structural demolition of concrete mezzanine floors
- Roof reinstatement and replacement works
- Asbestos removal
- Brick and blockwork repairs and renewals
- External drainage, paving and hardstandings
- Fencing works

- Internal stripout
- Stud partitioning, door sets, and joinery
- Forming disabled toilet blocks
- Structural steelwork
- General electric and plumbing works
- Finishes
